



Protecting ourselves from theft is hard enough, but when our senior loved ones are targeted, it's especially frustrating. Due to their vulnerability and propensity to trust so easily, scammers will often approach them in brazen, and often intimidating, ways.




We've had several reports in the area where seniors (normally females) have been approached at home by a female subject who claims they are running from a domestic violence situation or they contend to be a neighbor, who is pregnant, and is in need of a glass of water. The targeted senior then lets the suspect inside the home and they are then normally relieved of their cash, wallet, credit cards, etc.

These suspects prey on senior citizens because they feel they will be able to take advantage of them, which has turned out to be accurate in many of these cases.

Please take the time to sit down with the senior loved ones in your life and explain to them the risk and inherent dangers of allowing somebody they don't know into their home. Although we've had several suspects around the area committing this type of offense, it's important to point out to them they could be approached by *anybody, anytime, anywhere* and they need to be vigilant and very cautious if they are ever contacted by a stranger with a "sob story" of some sort. People know where to get help if they really need it; approaching a total stranger is normally not the wisest (or safest) way to go about finding legitimate assistance. If they are approached by somebody needing help, they can call 911 for them. They may be surprised when that subject, who needed help so badly, either declines the assistance of police, or. . . starts hot-footing it down the street!

Spring is Here!!!



Spring is here and foliage around the area is just starting to bud, bloom, and grow. Nothing is more beautiful than the State of Washington during the spring and summer months. As Washingtonians, we love our greenery and work very hard to keep it lush and plentiful.

BUT

(you knew there was a “but” coming, right?)

This lush landscaping can also create areas of isolation for those pesky burglars who are looking for any opportunity to break into someone’s home – maybe yours.

Do yourself a favor and keep the access areas to your home open and exposed, so the burglar feels ‘open and exposed’ when considering it for victimization. Because that’s what they do. They think to themselves: “Does my profit outweigh my risk at this home?”. And it’s up to us as homeowners to make sure the answer is a resounding NO!

- ✓ Keep foliage cut below windowsill level.
- ✓ Keep trees cut up to at least 4 feet.
- ✓ Don’t allow privacy hedges to become so tall or so thick that it is actually creating a privacy screen for burglars.
- ✓ Install padlocks on all your fence gates, and keep the landscaping near these gates cut back or trimmed down.
- ✓ If you have a slight berm in the front yard, keep in mind the landscaping that is planted there and the fact that as it grows, it may now block the view to your front door.

Our burglary rate is maintaining an average count, but burglaries are still being committed, and that average certainly doesn’t mean anything to the homeowner whose residence is targeted for burglary. Do your part to make your home inhospitable to burglars.

I would be happy to come out and conduct a security survey of your home. It only takes approximately 20-30 minutes and I will write up a user-friendly report that you can then use to reinforce your home from burglary. Please don’t think this type of incident won’t happen to you or your family – because it can, and it does, every day.
